## Our Home Reading Program Begins!!

## Your Child's Reading Level

Each spring our teachers complete a reading assessment with their students called the Fountas and Pinnell (F&P) Benchmark Assessment. This assessment reports to our teachers the reading level for each student. The reading levels are described by a letter code – A through Z. These levels can also be shared as a grade level equivalent, which means that when the assessment was completed for a student, the results place the student's reading level at the beginning, middle or end of year in a particular grade (for example, beginning grade 3). (At the bottom of this letter is the table that shows the letter code and the grade.) This information is collected at the end of the year to assist teachers in building an appropriate reading program for their students. Research indicates that students develop reading skill most efficiently, when they are working with material that is appropriate for their level.

## Your Child's Reading Goal

At the back of our student agendas we have a page dedicated to creating student "Home Reading Goals". We are asking that our students complete the first goal section that leads us to November Student-Parent-Teacher conferences on November 4 and 5. In order for them to reach their goal, our students must participate in home reading. In the student agenda there is chart that sets how many minutes students must read each month to help reach their goal. To honor our student's hard work, students who read their total amount of monthly minutes will receive a charm for their home reading bracelet. We hope by making home reading a priority, our students will increase in their F&P Benchmark Assessments over the year much more quickly than in years past.

#### Your Child's Grit

We need parent/guardian support to make our Home Reading Program a success. Please be sure to help your child with home reading and take the time to initial their agenda each evening. Parents are the most important teacher our students will have in their lives!!! We are hoping that not only home reading will increase our students reading levels but that they will also continue to develop their perseverance and grit in reaching the goals that they set for themselves.

## Voice and Choice

This year at St. Martin's we have rearranged a number of classrooms from grade 1 all the way to grade 6. We have redesigned our rooms to increase student engagement and to offer more "voice and choice" to our learners. Instead of having carpets in the corner for reading time, they are front and centre, with benches around the outside for additional seating. There are also tables and groups of desks where students can choose to sit and complete work. When the school day begins, students choose a space that they would like to work and our teachers are helping them understand how they best learn and to make choices that will maximize their learning opportunities each day. Teachers may call their students in small groups to the carpet for discussion or direct instruction and then send their students off to work in a variety of spaces in the classroom. These redesigned classrooms will allow students to be more collaborative and increase their engagement in learning. It is very exciting because



even though some of our classrooms have been around a while (like 100 years), the redesigns have made them feel new again.

Now this concept of creating student-centred spaces that offer student "voice and choice" is not new. During the past two years, we have sent a small contingent of staff to St. Timothy School in Edmonton, who have journeyed down this road a few years ago. We appreciate their leadership in this area, not to mention their amazing home reading program that they shared with us as well (starting in October). Thank you so much St. Timothy Elementary School!!!

In order to help make a vision of voice and choice happen at St. Martin's we decided to look for partnerships in our community. This past May, we hosted a luncheon at our school that was attended by many business and community leaders. We asked our audience for support for this initiative, which we called "The Alternative Environments Project" to reflect the altered learning spaces. We were hoping for a few donations to help us get started, but we were very surprised when one business donated \$3000.00 to help us begin this project. This money helped us purchase a number or carpets, benches, ottomans and storage containers to transform our classrooms. This tremendous donations was presented to the school last June from Flaman Rentals; thank you so much!!! We are very appreciative of your very generous donation and we are confident it will help our students learn.


## **Boston Pizza**




