Central Zone Oral Health Program School Oral Health Services


- → The Oral Health Program will be coming to your school to offer free fluoride varnish for all children from Kindergarten to grade 2. You can expect a consent to come home soon.
- → We will also provide free dental sealants for all grade 1 and 2 students who need them. A second consent form will be coming home with your grade 1 or 2 child for this service.
- → If your grade 3 child received sealants from us last year, we will recheck and repair them if needed. A consent form will be sent home with your grade 3 child.
